Opportunities for Ministry

God gives each of us talents and abilities for service – and expects us to use them for his glory and for the sake of other people. Many of you are already quite involved in ministries within our congregation, through our congregation, and outside of our congregation – and for that God gets all the thanks and praise. However, in order to guide, shape, and direct these ministries it is helpful to have a certain amount of structure under which we function. Your church council has been discussing the four 'umbrellas' of ministry (Ministry Teams) under which all other ministries in our congregation are to be organized. We realize that our individual groups are functioning well, but the Ministry Teams, in most cases, really don't exist. These Ministry Teams are defined by our bylaws as follows:

"Ministry of Nurturing" – Provides opportunities to learn more about God, Scripture, the sacraments, and our church; and oversees educational activities including Sunday Church School (youth and adult), Sunday morning nursery, Vacation Church School, Youth Groups, and Confirmation. They shall also promote communications through the use of the church's newsletter, the church library, etc.

"Ministry of Sharing" – Leads the congregation to reach out to one another and to other people in order to share the Gospel and connect them to Christ's Church. Ministries include such things as: Home visitation, Distribution of Communion to home bound members, Visitation of the sick, Intercessory prayer, Prayer chains, Women of the Church, Men of the Church, Funeral dinners, and mailing cards to members who are bereaved, college students, and those in the Armed Forces of the United States.

"Ministry of Stewarding" – Sees to the proper maintenance and protection of all property of the congregation. It also provides a property audit and shall project and plan for the future capital and financial needs of the congregation. This Ministry Team also provides financial oversight for the congregation

"Ministry of Celebrating" – Sees that the services of God's house are conducted regularly and that competent ushers, deacons, lay readers, and other worship assistants are recruited and trained. This Ministry Team shall recommend and evaluate the music personnel and program, arrange for the care of paraments, vestments, and musical instruments and (in consultation with the pastor and the musicians) shall provide for music supplies needed in the worship services of this congregation.

As you may be aware – many of you are already involved in ministries which fall under these 'umbrellas'. However, we are looking for more people who are willing to serve in oversight and planning for these various groups by serving along with other members on the various Ministry Teams. So, if you are interested in being a

member of one of the Teams, or if you have an idea for a new ministry, or if you would like to join a group that is already in existence please speak to the council member who serves as the liaison for the particular Ministry Team God is calling you to serve on. Your participation is a great service both to God and to His people, and your leadership will also be a valued gift to His Church.







On the first day, God separated light from darkness.
